Having a 12 hour notice period gives sprayers a tighter window to provide more accurate indication of when spraying will ACTUALLY occur. Creating more accurate workflows and timely notifications. Anything outside of that will create cutting of corners and excessive notifications which will give notifications a spam like nature and deem them useless.]	[Example text, replace with your reasoning: We strongly believe it to be unachievable to give no less than 24 hours notice.
