RPMP D(6), D(7), F(2	Any staff member or Contractor transporting material to the disposal site, or machinery to a decontamination site must take all practicable steps, including a physical inspection, to remove any weed or plant fragments.
RPMP D(6), D(7), F(2	The disposal site and method of disposal must be communicated and agreed to by myself to ensure it is appropriate; this communication needs to be in the form of an email.

The Bay of Plenty Regional Council hereby grants you exemption from the Regional Pest Management Plan rules listed above providing all conditions are adhered to.

The exemption may be revoked at any time at the sole discretion of the Bay of Plenty Regional Council.
