#### IMPORTANT INFORMATION

- Processing of the application by Bay of Plenty Regional Council will not begin until the deposit fee is paid, unless prior arrangement has been made. If, at the end of the processing of the application, the actual cost exceeds the deposit, you will be invoiced for the balance.
- You may also be required to pay a resource management charge associated with holding a consent. The Water Administration Team will be able to provide you with more details. All charges are in accordance with Section 36 of the Resource Management Act 1991. All accounts are payable by the 20<sup>th</sup> of the month following date of invoice. Where costs are incurred that exceed \$2,000 above the deposit, or at the end of every quarter, you may be requested to pay an additional amount by way of interim payment against the final total costs.
- The Coastal Marine Area is the area from the outer limit of the territorial sea (12 nautical miles) to the line of mean high-water springs. For activities at river mouths, please contact a consents officer at Bay of Plenty Regional Council for clarification.
