
1. TALT Deed Fund


Recognition of Te Arawa Mātauranga (traditional and contemporary)

Bring together and harnesses the collective power of passionate people


Te Arawa, Councils and the Crown are delivering obligations to beneficiaries, as determined in the TALSA 2006.


