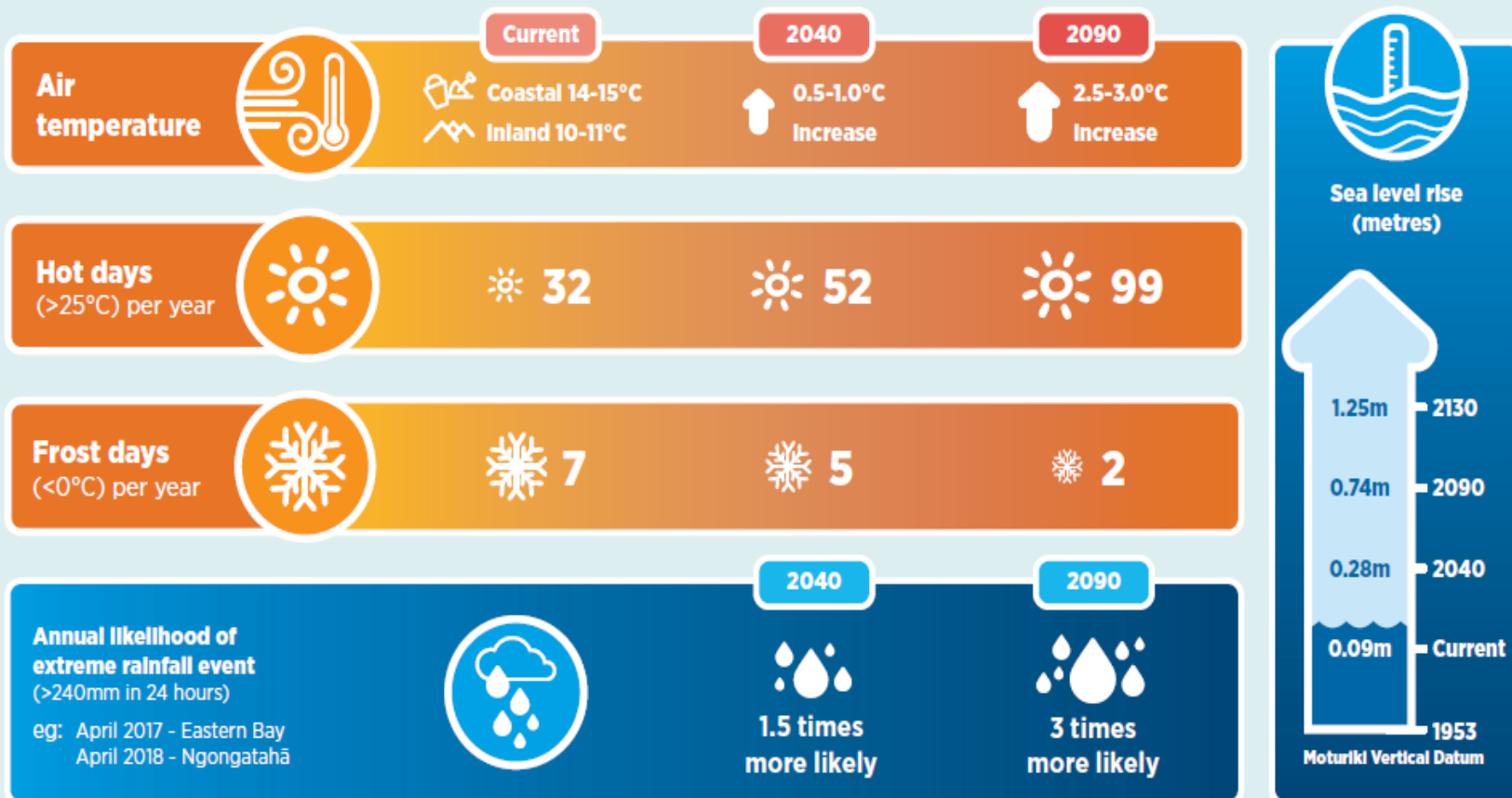
- Toitu Carbonreduce baseline audit completed
