| Policy KR 7B | 19 | Support in part | Amend Policy KR 7B as follows: <u>Policy KR 7B: Enabling economic development opportunities for iwi and hapu in the Kaituna River.</u> Enable economic development opportunities for iwi and hapu <u>and the wider community</u> , which respect and promote greater understanding of cultural associations with the Kaituna River and restore, protect or enhance the River's well-being. | The addition of <i>the wider community</i> is sought to reflect the Policy KR 7B link to Objective 46 which reads: Te Maru o Kaituna collaborate with iwi and the wider community to enable environmental, economic, social, educational and cultural aspirations for the restoration, protection and enhancement of the Kaituna River. This policy also supports the development of multiple-owned Māori land. |
| Policy KR 8B | 19 | Support in Part | <u>Policy KR 8B: Enabling recreational activities along the Kaituna River</u> The Te Tumu Urban Growth combined with the wider western Bay of Plenty growth will increase the demand for recreational access to the river. This should be noted in the explanation together with the opportunity provided in the Te Tumu Urban Growth Area for managed access to the river for the wider community. | The increased and future demand for access to the Lower Kaituna River for recreational activities needs to be acknowledged in the explanation, in order that it is planned for so that the Policy KR 8B can be achieved with respect to the Lower Kaituna River. |
