<p>Rachel Wolfgramm</p> <p>Te Whanau o Rangihaerepo of Te Upokorehe and Ngai Tamahua</p>	<p>Email received 13/3.</p> <p><i>Thank you for this notification and the summary document which is very informative. We are keen to keep progressing work that has a positive impact on Ohiwa Harbour environment and wish you all the best. However, I contacted Ben Wolfgramm who is a consultant working in New South Wales specialising in marine ecology. He was able to peruse the document and offered the following comments and we would appreciate some response to them.</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>The techniques are fine - but ecology is lacking. Sediment can be a problem but also occurs as a natural phenomenon .</i> • <i>If they plan works there needs to be some consideration of managing habitat -frogs, eels, fish, snails, vegetation, birds etc that coexist in the waterways. This usually requires some dialogue / acknowledgement/ consideration eg mapping, survey of flora fauna and protection controls. Creeks and waterways etc which drain into harbours are thick with ecology ie part of context - harbour/ intertidal/ riparian corridors etc.</i> • <i>Beyond that the biggest culprits harming waterways are direct connection of impervious areas, urbanisation and land practice - which I'm expecting NZ to be all over.</i>
<p>Raewyn Bennett</p> <p>Ngati Pikiāo</p>	<p>Email received 6/3.</p> <p><i>Ngati Pikiāo have customary interests at the mouth of the Waitahanui river. We would need more information on that specific site before we could comment any further. We have long-held concerns about the management of that area, Ngati Pikiāo being shareholders in Waewaehikitia No 1 which is a sand dune in private title (Maori Land) at the mouth of the Waitahanui, which has been subjected to bulldozing by local farmers at whim. This is not to deny the ahi kaa relationship of Ngati Makino, the co-applicants under the MACA application. I look forward to receiving more specific information.</i></p>
<p>Graham Te Rire</p> <p>Tuwharetoa ki te Tai</p>	<p>Email received 8/3 requesting meeting and site visit. Subsequent correspondence confirmed area of interest is between Otamarakau and Matata. Willing to participate in a joint site visit with other iwi.</p>
<p>Anthony Olsen</p> <p>Ngati Rangitihī</p>	<p>Email received 7/3. Requested further discussion regarding application document and additional matters requiring consideration.</p>
<p>Chris (Karamea) Insley</p> <p>Hapu and Whanau of Te Whanau a Apanui (Awanui Haparapara NoI Lands Trust)</p>	<p>Email received 7/3 requesting further discussion. Subsequent discussion explaining scope and nature of activities, specifically that the works are undertaken in response to issues that have arisen, rather than works planned and scheduled well in advance. Confirmed that the proposal was acceptable and written confirmation of this to be provided.</p>

Discussed general scope of application, purpose of consultation (MACA legislation), specific areas affected by the application and area of interest of Ngati Rua (Otara River to Torere). Subsequently provided hard copy of documentation for discussion at Marae hui on 18/3.</p>
