

Export volumes loaded at the Port of Tauranga decreased 3.5% in the last year




State highway general and heavy traffic volumes continued to increase

SAFETY

Fatalities (39) and serious injuries (205) increased on our roads between 2018 and 2019 and the five year average continued to trend upwards



Alcohol was identified as a contributing factor in **43**% of all deaths and serious injuries.



Speed was identified as a contributing factor in **22%** of all deaths and serious injuries.



Drugs were identified as a contributing factor in **14%** of all deaths and serious injuries






The social cost of deaths and serious injuries on the region's road network was estimated to be **\$483M** in 2019






LAND USE & TRANSPORT INTEGRATION

Annual bus trips per person, Bay of Plenty




In 2019 the mode share for land based freight movements in and out of the Port of Tauranga container terminal was...


Average annual **nitrogen dioxide** concentrations were

Rotorua (concentrations above 30 micrograms may have adverse effects on human health)


Average annual No₂ concentrations
