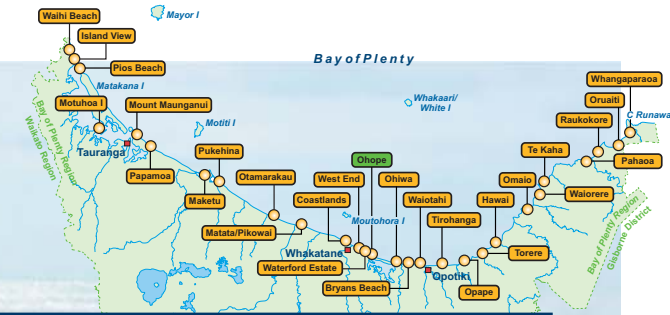


Back Yard Buffers Project

This project aims to encourage and assist people to restore native plant communities on dune areas adjacent to their properties. These places are often mid to back dune zones, but have become overgrown by weeds. Many of the plants native to these zones have become endangered, along with the creatures that depend on them e.g. Geckos, Skinks, Copper Butterflies, Sand Locust etc. Support for this restoration initiative is escalating as people experience the naturally colourful and textural landscape that emerges from the weeds.
