On the basis of the recommendation to council by OPUS (2015) requiring resource consents for methyl bromide (as required by current plan), except where recapture technology. In which case is should be a controlled, non-notified activity.
P147			Recapture / destruction requirements by the BoPRC are taken from the EPA's decision allowing a fumigants use in new Zealand. Such requirements are determined by the EPA after their review of the science submitted to support the use of the chemical as a fumigant. Internationally the EPA is highly regarded for its transparent and robust process in considering new chemicals and their formulation of controls which can protect the public, workers and the environment.	The scientific and technical expertise to analyse relevant data, identify risks and determine appropriate mitigations sits within the EPA. Draslovka anticipates that the EPA will not require the use of recapture technologies with EDN fumigations as the science indicates there are no significant quantities of EDN remaining at the end of fumigation.
