A feature of the venue is its open fireplace located in a covered garden bar, which was installed at the premises in 2016. The submitter is interested in the parts of the plan change relating to the Rotorua Airshed, and the application of provisions to its fireplace (which appears to be classified as a non-complying solid fuel burner under proposed rule AQ R14). While the submitter generally supports the reasons for the plan change as they relate to the Rotorua Airshed, the potential implications for its activities of the new provisions as notified are not considered to be appropriate or justified on the basis that: • The plan change does not appear to have been developed with reference to the particular that the contract of the particular contracts of the particular contracts.

				 The submitter has been advised by the Bay of Plenty Regional Council that its activities do not breach the Rotorua Air Quality Control Bylaw 2017. It is unclear why a different outcome is appropriate or necessary under the plan change;
				 The fireplace feature contributes significantly to the amenity of the premises (which itself contributes to the vibrancy of the CBD) and should be able to be enjoyed by patrons who, if residents of Rotorua, are no longer able to have an open fire in their homes; and
