- 1 Character and degree of modification, damage, loss or destruction;
- 2 Duration and frequency of effect (for example long-term or recurring effects);
- 3 Magnitude or scale of effect (for example number of sites affected, spatial distribution, landscape context);
- Irreversibility of effect (for example loss of unique or rare features, limited opportunity for remediation, the costs and technical feasibility of remediation or mitigation);
- Resilience of heritage value or place to change (for example ability of feature to assimilate change, vulnerability of feature to external effects);
- Opportunities to remedy or mitigate pre-existing or potential adverse effects (for example restoration, enhancement), where avoidance is not practicable;
- Probability of effect (for example likelihood of unforeseen effects, ability to take precautionary approach);
- 8 Cumulative effects (for example loss of multiple locally significant features).
