Population concept matching cards

Population Geography

The thematic study of how the distribution, diversity, movement and growth of a population relate to the environment a population inhabits.

Population Concepts

Big ideas that are used to account for different population relevant situations.

Population

People who inhabit a particular location.

Population Diversity

Composition of a population.

Whakanohonoho

Māori settlement was chiefly governed by access to resources.

Population Distribution

How a population is distributed across the landscape.

Whakapapa

The genealogy of a taonga or person (ancestral and/or historical) with linkages to other taonga or persons.

Tūrangawaewae

Place where one has rights of residence and belonging through kinship and whakapapa.

Population Changes

Population trends over time.

Hekenga

Migration occurs to meet the needs of Māori at any one time and in response to outside forces.

Population Movement

Migration and mobility within a population.

Taonga

A resource either physical or cultural that can be found in the environment (including features within the environment – lakes, mountains, rivers, also including people, te reo, whakapapa etc.).

Population Sustainability

The capacity of the environment to support a population in the longer term.
