Carrus Corporation Limited's submission on Proposed Change 5 is made in the context of:

- 1. Broad support for Proposed Change 5 to the Regional Policy Statement.
- 2. Recognition that the proposed Te Tumu Urban Growth Area is located within the Kaituna River co-governance area and the provisions of Proposed Change 5 apply to the TUGA.

Recognition that the proposed Te Tumu Urban Growth Area as provided for in the Regional Policy Statement and supported by the National Policy Statement on Urban Development, is an important part of the future of both the Bay of Plenty and the western Bay of Plenty sub-region.
