Something about the Mount just doesn't smell right, especially driving across the bridge into The Mount the toxic smell from the industrial area and plants just hits you in the face and makes you gag - not a great advertisement for our beautiful beach town.

When the wind is blowing towards the Omanu area and the bitumen plants are on it often smells so bad at our house, clothes smell of bitumen if left on the washing line, I can't sit outside and enjoy the sunshine if the plants are operating and the wind is blowing in the direction of our home, as it stinks and worst of all is when you smell it on your children's school field and outside the classrooms.

In the morning we are often greeted with the putrid smell of pet food from Ziwi, then throughout the day it is a strong bitumen odour and sometimes also a strong fiberglass smell from a pool manufacturer - oh the joys of living in Mount Maunganui.

While at a tangi at Whareroa Marae today, I got 3 different stenches it wasnt nice at all.

Last week the smell by the Fertilizer Works was toxic



ODOUR RELATED (4 of 4)





This image is typical of what we experience- constant industrial dust we wipe from our homes internally from furniture and bench & table tops and floors along with exterior outdoor living areas and constant house washing. You have to wipe the clothes line daily before using due to the dust. I hate to think how much we breathe in both during the day and especially at night when a lot of activity is taking place so we don't see the dust so visually. This issue is seriously detrimental to our health and the government and current Commissioners must address. Mounties pay the highest rates and get the least return. We all need to speak up and push back on this issue.

This is a constant issue on Maunganui Road. Black dust most likely diesel discharge as we are only about 1 block from the port. Bad, but worse when there are cruise ships in over the summer.

I don't want to be forced to leave Mt Maunganui, but when my wife says she can no longer deal with the putrid odor wafting across during the predominant SW breeze I struggle to have an argument to stay. Especially now we have young children to consider.

Well, I can count 6 cancers from the prevailing wind on Gordon road and Lee st in the last 5 years / me included !!!!

Thank you! I feel you have nailed it with the mental health side if things. I have cried with frustration and worry about this. I'm often pondering uprooting our whole life due to the constant air pollution that is so intrusive to my wellbeing, mentally and emotionally as well.
