## **Local Government Official Information Request – Passenger Transport Levy**

We refer to your Request for information under the Local Government Official Information and Meetings Act 1987 (LGOIMA) regarding Public Transport funding sources, which was received by the Bay of Plenty Regional Council (Council) on 29 February 2024.

## Funding received from each source of income from bus fares, advertising, Government subsidies and rates

The Funding Impact Statement for the year ended 30 June 2023 for Transport and Urban Planning on page 63 of the Annual Report 2022/23 details the sources of operating funding for this activity.
